## EXPERIENCE WITH CLASS ACTION SUITS

### M.E. v. Bush:

Consultant to Holland & Knight, LLC (complainants' attorneys) for this Florida child welfare case. Role involved examination of data on provision of mental health services to youth and children by the child welfare and juvenile justice systems. The case was settled out of court in 2001. As a result, not deposed, did not testify, but was actively involved with this suit from 1999 to 2001.

### Willie M. Consent Decree:

Consultant to the State of North Carolina about service provision and measurement of outcomes in this case which mandated the provision of comprehensive mental health services for assaultive and emotionally disturbed youth instead of supervision of such youth by the justice system. This case remained under court supervision from 1979 through 1998. Direct involvement with the Willie M. Program occurred between 1993 and 1998, while serving on Willie M. Research Advisory Committee through the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services. Served as a Co-Principal Investigator on a research study (1998-2002) on mental health services for these youth.

### Alexander A. v. Novello:

Complaint involved length of time spent on waitlist by youth qualified for placement in a residential treatment facility. Participation included review of documents, preparation of expert witness report for Attorney General's office, and deposition testimony taken on October 2, 2003. Case was settled out of court in July, 2004, and reopened in October, 2004. Additional participation has not been requested.

### Rosie D. v. State of Massachusetts:

Current involvement in this Massachusetts case is minimal as a member of a small group of local and national experts on children's mental health services. Consultation has included reviewing of draft proposals on discrete issues (i.e., eligibility criteria, covered services, outcomes, etc.) and providing advice on how to assess and respond to the defendants' proposals. The complaint as filed addressed the state's failure to provide adequate services for youth with serious emotional disturbance. Participation in this case was initiated in July 2003; deposition was taken on November 11, 2004; and expert witness testimony in court was provided on April 26, 2005. Continuing involvement as member of expert panel on programmatic issues. On January 26, 2006, the court ruled in favor of the plaintiffs. The final remedial order hearing began December 12, 2006. A final judgment was issued on July 17, 2007; further involvement is likely to involve occasional consultation regarding implementation of home and community-based services by the State.
